



Agnes Larsen Darnell Scholarship

This scholarship is available to Aleut shareholders and their descendants who are seniors in high school with a 3.0 gpa or better and will be attending a 4 year university. The \$1000 per year scholarship will be awarded each Fall for four years with proof of enrollment, \$4000 total. The winner will be required to submit their grades to us at the end of each year.

Agnes Larsen was born in 1934 in St. Paul, AK. She grew up in King Cove where she went to school until the 8th grade. She graduated high school at Mt. Edgecumbe and went on to Western College in Bellingham, WA where she

earned her teaching credential. She taught at Wrangell Institute and in King Cove. She loved teaching and thought her Alaska students were “so smart.”

She went on to earn her BS in History from University of Nevada, Reno. It was in Reno where she met her husband, Larry Darnell. Larry believes that as long as one person remembers your name, your spirit will never die. So, after her passing in 1999, he established a scholarship to help her fellow Alaskan students whom she believed in.

This scholarship is very personal to us. I am not just the administrator of this award, Agnes was my mother. The other board members are her sister and her niece.
